

Candidate Conversation Guide

Your vote is your voice, and it goes especially far in state elections. These races are decided by fewer votes than other elections, but they still have profound impacts on how your community is shaped. Getting to know candidates ahead of time is crucial for making an informed decision at the polls. This guide will help you meaningfully engage with candidates when they call or knock on your door.

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How will you promote affordable homeownership?

Homeownership is key. It's the main way most families build wealth and become financially resilient. Safe and stable housing means children excel in school, workers earn, seniors thrive, and communities prosper.

If elected, what steps will you take to increase the supply of affordable homes?

The need for housing is significant and growing. Kentucky needs around 207,000 more housing units just to serve its current population. Warren County is currently the leading county in population growth in the state, needing roughly 14,000 housing units to serve our current population; which is projected to double by 2050.

How will you protect homeowners and work to preserve existing affordable housing?

It's important that families who already have affordable housing can stay in their homes. Systems need to be in place to 1) prevent homeowners from falling into condemnation or foreclosure during economic uncertainty, and 2) preserve the affordable homes in our housing stock.

September 19th - October 20th

Online portal is open to request an absentee ballot.

October 5th

Last day to register to vote! Register online to vote by 4pm local time if you are not already registered. You can register to vote at elect.ky.gov



October 21st

In-person absentee voting begins. Excused absentee voting Oct 21st - 23rd and 26th - 28th. Early in-person voting Oct 29th - 31st.



November 3rd

Election Day!!! Polls are open from 6am to 6pm. All mail-in absentee ballots must be received by the County Clerk by 6pm.
